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Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The advancement of education, the advancement of religion, the relief of poverty and the assistance in the provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time occupation in the interests of social welfare with the object of improving the conditions of life for the people of Romania, in particular but not exclusively, children and the elderly, by providing financial and other assistance.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Receipts from fund raising in the UK were £15,955 and grants totalling £16,000 were made to Romania during the year. The grants were: £1,200 towards the cost of the children's summer holiday camp; £1,100 humanitarian relief; £1,181 towards the cost of weekly youth club events, £2280 wages for 2 youth workers, £2,000 transport appeal; £8,239 to cast the stage of the youth hall project and purchase bricks for use in 2007.

The current policy on grant making is that all grants are made to Fundatia Emanuel Betania, a not-for-profit company registered in Teius, Romania.

There is no policy to invest funds. Funds not required for immediate use are held in a Nat West savings account.

The trustees are personally responsible for their own travel and administration costs. All volunteers are required to be self funding.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

No changes to structure and activities within the UK during 2006. Our website was restructured www.fundeb.org.uk A DVD was produced in November illustrating our summer camp and Christmas present work. Financial support was received from a broader base of organisations and business in 2006, as well as individuals.

The purchase of a twin-cab pickup truck was sponsored in Romania.

We were pleased that the orphanage at Stremt voted us best sponsor for 2006.

Progress on the new youth hall was slower than anticipated mainly due to poor availability of local contractors. This will be remedied in 2007.

A number of humanitarian projects were completed to provide heating or new roofs for houses.

Aid delivered to Romania included: 30 second hand computers, 5 printers, 10 mobile phones, an electric organ, school materials, toys and sports equipment.

Weekly youth clubs continue in Teius, and Bucurdea Granoasa, reaching over 80 children. This includes sport, music and painting lessons.

A Spring conference attracted 180 teenagers.

Three summer holiday camps catered for 250 children, half of whom were sponsored by the charity and half by other organisations. The children were given a blue T-shirt.

671 presents were distributed at Christmas to schools in Teius and the surrounding community, plus 100 presents in Cornesti.

Good progress has been achieved during 2006 networking with local organisations and individuals in Romania.

At year end £4,895 was being held towards the cost of Romanian youth worker wages and the cost of constructing the walls of the youth hall in Teius, Romania.
